# Forgiveness Sunday

"...seventy times seven... The last Sunday before the start of the Great Lent fast is usually referred to as **Cheesefare Sunday**. However in the *Lenten Triodion*, the Church's prayer book that provides for all our services during Lent, it is called **Forgiveness Sunday**. In the Service of Forgiveness, at the end of the Divine Liturgy, we say to each other "Forgive me, a sinner" and we reply to each other "God forgives you".


This reminds us, as we enter the period of abstinence, reflection and repentance, of Our Saviour's commandment to forgive each other so that we might be forgiven by Our Heavenly Father.

This is always an important occasion so please make the effort to be there. There are currently some vacancies — so why not think about doing a bit more?
